# WHAT IS FAMILY (OR HOME-BASED) CHILD CARE?

- A small business operated in the business owners' home as a Group Child Care Home licensed for up to 14 children or a Family Child Care Home licensed for up to 7 children.
- License-exempt providers (LEP) are enrolled by MDE to care for child care subsidy-eligible children and are another form of home-based child care, supporting up to 6 children in their home (related providers) or the child's home (unrelated providers).

# WHAT ARE FAMILY CHILD CARE NETWORKS (FCCNS)?

FCCNs are organizations that connect, stabilize, and support home-based child care businesses by addressing their common challenges and offering:

- 1. **Tangible business and financial support** that promotes solutions and sustainability.
- 2. **Tools and training** to increase capacity and enhance quality practices.
- Business owner connections to share effective practices and promote wellbeing.

#### HOME-BASED CHILD CARE MEETS FAMILY NEEDS AND PREFERENCES BY:



Offering greater flexibility, such as non-traditional hours beyond 9-5.



Providing a smaller, more personal atmosphere with individualized support and continuity of care, since children can remain with the same caregiver.



Offering culturally informed and responsive care, since providers are more likely to share common language, culture, race, or ethnicity.







## BENEFITS FOR MI EMPLOYERS & SMALL BUSINESSES

- More child care options and availability to meet needs and preferences.
- Increased access to child care, since home-based care is often less costly than centers and is the only type of child care that exists in some rural communities.
- Increased economic growth and development due to new and sustained child care businesses.
- Stronger local economies due to continuity and growth of small businesses.
- Helps businesses retain staff that are also parents by supporting and increasing the child care available to them.
- Increases child care availability for parents who work non-traditional hours.



Home-based child care businesses are an essential component of quality child care infrastructure in Michigan. Family Child Care Networks are critical in sustaining these small businesses.
