- Connecting families with essential community resources and services

The Need for Increased Funding for Rural Home Visiting (HV) Programs

- Stagnant Funding: Rural HV programs, such as Healthy Families, have received the same level of funding for many years, despite rising costs and demand
- Critical Support: For many rural parents, a home visitor is a crucial outside contact and a key resource for real-time information as they navigate the challenges of new parenting


Our Request:

We ask to maintain funding for home visiting services and increase rural area funding by \$2.25 million to a total of \$5 million to better reflect the true cost of care.

Play and Learn Strategies™ (PALS- Infant)	PALS-Infant is designed to strengthen parent-child bonding and stimulate children's early language, cognitive, and social development.	Enrollment & Service length: Babies from 5-18 months for 10 weeks.	Visit frequency is weekly.
Maternal Infant Health Program (MIHP)	MIHP offers home visits from caring and trustworthy social workers and nurses who work in partnership with families to ensure they feel supported through pregnancy and parenthood.	Enrollment: Medicaid-eligible pregnant persons and infants through 12 months of age. Service Length: Services continue throughout pregnancy and up to 18 months of age based on the needs of the infant and their caregiver.	Visits are offered monthly but may b more frequent.
Nurse-Family Partnership™ (NFP)	Registered nurses work to build a trusting and therapeutic partnership with first-time pregnant parents, aimed at improving pregnancy outcomes, improving child health and development and improving the economic self-sufficiency of the family. Infant Mental Health (IMH)	Infant Mental Health Home Visiting works with parents/caregivers that have difficulty forming a positive attachment with their infant, toddler which can affect their social, emotional, behavioral, and cognitive development. Services are provided by Infant Mental Health providers.	Enrollment & Service length: Pregnancy through age 3, has income guidelines.	Visits are usually weekly to bi-weekly.
Early Head Start™ (EHS)	Early Head Start knows parents are their child's first and most important teacher. EHS supports families to be healthy and helps parents understand how their child grows and develops.	Enrollment & Service length: Pregnancy through age 3, has income guidelines.	Visits are weekly fo 90 minutes.
Family Spirit™ (FS)	Family Spirit was developed for and by American Indian communities. Supports health of family and builds strong and healthy parents.	Enrollment: Must be a member of a family in the respective Tribal Service population. Service length: Pregnancy through 3-5 years of age.	Visit frequency is weekly to monthly
Healthy Families America™ (HFA)	HFA believes early, nurturing relationships are the foundation for healthy development. Home visitors walk alongside caregivers on their parenting journeys and provide support, encouragement, guidance and education.	Enrollment: timeframe is pregnancy to 24 months Service Length: home visitors can support families for 3 to 5 years.	Visit frequency is weekly to monthly
Parents as Teachers™ (PAT)	Home visitors support parents in developing healthy relationships with their children. Supports and engages families in their roles as first and best teachers through positive connections and guidance.	Enrollment & Service length: pregnancy through kindergarten entry, no income guidelines.	Visit frequency is weekly to monthly
